227 Rully 'En Bas de Vauvry' Jean-Baptiste Ponsot 2017

100% Chardonnay. Domaine Jean-Baptiste Ponsot was taken over in 2000 by Jean-Baptiste himself - 20 years of age. The family business started in 1954 with the Grandfather and now owns vines in the best soils of the appellation in which two-thirds Rully 1er Cru. In the vineyard, He employs organic practices but hasn't sought out certification. In 2005 Jean-Baptiste built a new winery - The wines are aged in barrels (30% new oak) for 12 months and then assembled in tank for a period of 3 to 6 months to keep maximum freshness. Jean-Baptiste quickly gained a local and international recognition.

Tasting notes :

An aromatic expression of citrus, apple, pear with aromas of almonds in the background. Fresh, fruity and lively attack, with lemon notes, followed by pear and almonds.

224 Chablis 1er Cru 'Fourchaume'

Domaine Chenevières, Frédéric Gueguen 2016

100% Chardonnay. Organic. In 2003, Bernard and Lucette Tremblay, owners of the domaine located in la Chapelle Vaupelteigne retired. To continue and develop the domaine, they chose Frédéric Gueguen, nephew of Jean Durup, first owner of Chablis with whom Frédéric learned a lot before becoming his cellar Master. The growth of the domain is nowadays possible thanks to the structural backing of his wife's family domaine: Domaine JM Brocard. Tasting notes :

An aromatic expression of citrus, butter, green apple with flint aromas in the background. Crunchy, lively, yet smooth, with a lot of minerality balanced by lemon and cream flavors.

272 Collines Rhodaniennes 'Viognier de Rosine' Stéphane Ogier Rhône 2015

100% Viognier. Domaine Stéphane Ogier is a family business set in the town of Ampuis for the last 7 generations. Whereas many wine producers take a lifetime to make wines of note, Stéphane Ogier is already a hero for the Northern Rhône Valley. He showed great promise from an early age, receiving 100 points from Robert Parker for his Côte-Rotie "Belle Helene" 1999, when he was only twenty two but it is in his recent years that his talent has begun to mature into a confident, consistent brilliance. Stéphane studied in Beaune for 5 years and it is clear the influence that Burgundy has had on his style of wines. He has adopted a pragmatic approach to his vinification process, resulting in outstanding wines.

Tasting notes :

A precise expression of white flowers, apricot, and white pepper, with hints of honey in the background. Rich, complex, yet lively attack, with notes of white flowers, stone fruits, and lovely spices in the long finish.

239 Sancerre, Domaine Vacheron, Loire 2017

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Domaine Vacheron is one of Sancerre's elite properties, producing both white and red Sancerre of amazing purity and definition. The domaine has been completely transformed over to biodynamic farming (certified by Biodyvin in 2005) with two young cousins, Jean-Laurent and Jean-Dominique Vacheron, at the helm. No synthetic material is used in the vineyard, harvests are carried out exclusively by hand, and the only fertilizer used is produced from the compost pile. Yields are kept extremely low. Having inherited some of the most coveted parcels in the appellation (and being smart about current land purchases), the cousins are trying a Burgundian approach to Sancerre winemaking, with parcels being vinified by terroir and blends varying from year to year.

Tasting notes :

Aromas of white flowers, lemon verbena, peach and mint. Lemon flavours on the palate, the finish is subtle and fruity with great length. Serve as an aperitif, seafood, shellfish and white meats.

236 Vin des Allobroges 'Argile' Domaine des Ardoisières, Savoie 2016 65

40% Chardonnay, 40% Jacquère, 20% Mondeuse . Domaine des Ardoisières was created in 1998 by the iconic Michel Grisard. Brice Ormont joined the team in 2005 and took it over five years later. The vineyard was planted on steep slopes (up to 60%) only with local grape varieties like Jacquère, Mondeuse, Altesse, and Persan. Brice Ormont's rigorous work in the vineyard is the key asset of the wine quality. Every action that is run in the vineyard aims to convey to grapes, therefore to wines, the identity of each plot. This biodynamic vineyard is run with passion and respect of the living world

Tasting Notes :

Vin des Allobroges Argile offers an aromatic finesse based on notes of lemon and pine resin, with a subtle acidulous and mineral background. Ample and powerful attack, followed by a lovely texture, finishing on lime zest, lemon and pine resin.

274 Bordeaux Blanc 'Sainte-Radegonde' Château Jean Faux 2016

85% Sauvignon Blanc & 15% Semillon. Biodynanic production. Chateau Jean Faux is a sumptuous property with more than five centuries of history. Perfectly located on the village of Sainte Radegonde, on the hills facing Saint Emilion and Castillon. The soils of Jean Faux are a key asset for the vine. Near St-Emilion, the terroir was confirmed exceptional through observations and analyses by microbiologists. Pascal Colotte bought this estate in 2002, with his first vintage released being the 2003. With the help of Stephane Derenoncourt, the famous wine consultant, they get the best of this exceptional terroir.

Tasting Notes :

Bordeaux Blanc "Château Jean Faux" opens with an aromatic expression of dried lemon and white flower with vegetal notes like grass and lemongrass in the background. Complex flavors of of lime, lemon, verbena, pineapple with a lovely purity of fruit and balanced by lots of freshness.

552 Markus Molitor Dry Riesling 'Haus Klosterberg' Mosel Germany 2017/18

100% Riesling. Organic. Described as 'The Lord of the 1,000 Rieslings', Markus Molitor took over the responsibility of his parents' 7.5 acre estate in 1984. Vision, drive and an uncompromising devotion to quality have increased the holding to 125 acres in 18 appellations of the steepest and most coveted vineyard sites along the banks of the Mosel. In the spirit of authenticity and terroir, all of these wines are fermented naturally – no cultured yeasts, no fining agents, no enzymes and no other additives are ever used. Each wine (of which we have chosen but a small selection) expresses the single vineyard character, the vintage, the quality and the style, to its extreme authenticity.

Tasting notes :

A dry Riesling. A clear nose with aromas reminiscent of ripe fruits in combination with fresh herbs. On the palate notes of stone fruits, powerful slate mineral: animating.

417 Toscana 'Collezione Privata' Chardonnay, Isole e Olena 125 Italy 2016/17

100% Chardonnay. The name 'Isole e Olena' came about in the 1950s when two adjoining estates, 'Isole' and 'Olena', were purchased by the De Marchi family and combined to form one. The history of both estates dates back many hundreds of years, and the earliest documentation of the village of Olena goes as far back as the 12th century. During the 1950s, the De Marchi family planted specialised vineyards and expanded the cellars. Today, the estate is run by Paolo De Marchi and his wife Marta. Paolo comes from a family with three generations of winemaking experience in the northern part of Piemonte and his older son, Luca, now runs the family estate there, Proprietà Sperino.

Tasting notes :

An inviting golden colour. Rich aromas of toasted almonds with buttery notes. On the palate, there is great balance between rich, ripe fruit, creamy brioche and complex minerality. Full-bodied, the palate extends through to a long finish.

WHITE WINES NEW ZEALAND, AUSTRALIA, U.S.A.

673 Grosset 'Springvale' Waterval Riesling Clare Valley South Australia 2012/17

100% Riesling. Organic. Hilltop-sited 'Springvale' is the highest (460m) and coolest vineyard in the Watervale sub-region. Planted on red loam over limestone, for which this area is renowned, this is a 'soft rock' site. This highly sustaining combination of soil and rock insulates the drought sensitive Riesling, which produces lime-green fruit with medium sized berries and fuller bunches. 'Springvale' is named after the original property where Riesling was first planted in the 1860s. Tasting notes :

Lemon, lime blossom aromatics and intense, pure tangy lime juice. Fine and impeccably focused, powerful and tight with mouth-watering zesty quartz minerality on a bone-dry finish that lingers. Layer after layer of flavour washes over the palate followed by a balanced, satisfying, taut grip.

668 Craggy Range 'Te Muna' Sauvignon Blanc Martinborough New Zealand 2018

800 Château Montelena, Chardonnay, Napa Valley USA 2014

Chateau Montelena Winery, originally called A.L. Tubbs winery after its founder Alfred Tubbs, was constructed in 1888 and intended as a barrel-aging facility. The Chateau was unique in materials, plan, size, and style for its era. In nineteenth-century Napa Valley, the majority of wineries were constructed of wood. Instead, the Chateau is made of stone with walls three to twelve feet thick, which provides natural insulation against outside heat or cold. Similarly, the structure built into a hillside, to further regulate temperature - something necessary for producing quality wines but uncommon at the time. Also rare among Napa Valley wineries, the Chateau resembles an English Gothic castle gatehouse complete with rusticated stone walls, battlement with crenels and merlons, narrow arched windows, large arched door in the place of a portcullis, and bartizans with faux arrow slits.

Tasting notes : Ripe peach, pear and cloves dominate the nose, followed by a flurry of floral and honeysuckle notes. There's a wonderful fullness and weight on the palate punctuated by ripe melon, green apple, and fresh citrus. The oak contribution remains subtle with a hint of vanilla and baking spice.

1152 Savigny-les-Beaune 'Aux Grands Liards' Simon Bize 2010 115

100% Pinot Noir. Organic. Domaine Simon Bize & Fils was created in 1880 by the great grandfather Simon Bize, who owned a few vineyard parcels. The holdings are, with minor exceptions, entirely within the Savigny AOC, a mix of 1er Cru and Villages wines. Viticulture is all important here, taking care of generally old vines, without chemicals or pesticides. Winemaking is an art, making the most of low yields using traditional methods. The result is a range of wines of quality -This is without any doubt Savigny's leading domaine.

Tasting notes :

An intense expression of red berries, cherries and figs, with a lovely hint of spices and truffles. Velvety, complex, yet balanced, expressing notes of black berries and figs, with an undergrowth finish.

1110 Gevrey Chambertin, Domaine Taupenot-Merme 2012

100% Pinot Noir. Organic. The roots of the family estate go back to the 1760s. Today's superb vineyard holdings in Gevrey-Chambertin, Morey- St-Denis and Chambolle-Musigny were united by the marriage of two winemaking families three generations ago. Romain Taupenot and his sister Virginie are the 7th generation to continue the family tradition. Parcels include significant pieces of both Charmes-Chambertin, Mazoyères-Chambertin and a great line-up of 1er Cru including Combe d'Orveau in Chambolle-Musigny.

Tasting notes :

A cool, restrained and admirably pure nose offers up notes of wild dark berries, earth, underbrush and game scents. There is a hint of minerality to the medium-bodied flavors that are supported by firm but fine-grained tannins. There is good punch and lovely balance to the lingering finish and this is really very good.

1150 Beaune Premier Cru 'Aux Cras' Maison Champy 2015

1001 Saint-Emilion Grand Cru, Château Morillon 2012

80% Merlot - 20% Cabernet Franc. This property, located in a small town just east of Saint-Émilion, enjoys the clay-based terroirs typical of this appellation that are so well-suited to Merlot and Cabernet Franc. The 40-year-old vines are planted on gentle, sloping hills, ensuring good sun exposure and vineyard health throughout the year. The winemaking incorporates the best of tradition and modernity, with fermentation carried out in concrete and stainless steel vats and aging in one and two year-old oak barrels.

Tasting notes :

The richness and depth of the clay soils shows through in this characterful wine with hints of graphite amongst the attractive juicy fruit. The palate is ripe and generous with great plummy fruit and a lovely finish.

1060 Pessac-Léognan, Pessac-Léognan de Malartic-Lagravière 2014 120

1519 Pomerol, Le Jardin de Petit Village 2013

100% Merlot. The vineyard sits at the highest point of Pomerol, where soils are the most gravelly and thus drainage is optimised, which is an advantage in the maritime climate. The subsoil is known as 'crasse de fer', an iron-rich clay that is said to confer such complexity to the greatest wines of Pomerol. Lower yields in the vineyards, a new barrel cellar and fermentation vats have all been implemented by Daniel Llose and Serge Ley, who oversee the work in the vineyards and the winery between them. Le Jardin de Petit Village is the second wine of Château Petit Village. Tasting notes :

Powerful and yet elegant wine with substance, a certain tension and great finesse. The colour is almost black; the bouquet boasts crisp, refined fruit, followed by immense length and that freshness that is so characteristic of the site of Château Petit Village.

1507 Crozes-Hermitage 'Equinoxe' Domaine des Lises 2017 60

1035 Vacqueyras 'Cuvée Doucinello' Domaine le Sang des Cailloux 2017

70% Grenache, 20% Syrah & 10% Mourvèdre. Biodynamic production. Domaine Le Sang des Cailloux was founded in 1975 by Serge Fergioule in the appellation of Vacqueyras with most of the vineyards planted on the plateau of Sarrians, surrounded by "garrigues". Here, it's all about the vines. The vineyard is grown following biodynamic principles. The management philosophy and techniques have helped to create vineyards that are bursting with vitality and biodiversity. This gives Serge a raw material of grapes that are both more expressive of their origins as well as having lower pH levels. This is turn has brought more freshness to the wines as well as enabling Serge to use lower levels of sulphites.

Tasting notes :

An aromatic expression of fig, blackberry, and black pepper, with hints of liquorice in the background. Rich, elegant, and savoury attack, marked by notes of black fruits, black berries, and spices, with mellow tannins in the finish.

1510 Cornas, Domaine du Tunnel, Stéphane Robert 2013

100% Syrah. Stéphane's Cornas is made from 15 parcels of Syrah from the following lieu dits: Combe, Patou, Sauman, Champelrose, Les Saveaux, Les Eygats, Les Cotes, Les Mazards, La Geynale and Cayret. The blending of parcels from several lieu dits gives the wine layers of complexity and character. The vines are about 50 years old on average and planted on steep granitic slopes which require them to be trained on individual stakes, and the harvest can only be carried out by hand.

Tasting notes :

The Cornas has a lovely deep colour with a ripe and spicy nose of fragrant black fruits. The tannins are smooth but structured. Stéphane's wines have this appealing concentration of fruit, finesse and purity that is profound and mouthfilling.

Argile from Domaine des Ardoisières has an aromatic expression of red berries, with a mineral background reminiscent of stones. Crunchy attack with pomegranate and currant flavors, then mineral and peppery, with a dry finish.

1501 Chinon 'Les Pensées de Pallus' Domaine de Pallus, Loire Valley 2015 80

100% Cabernet Franc. Bertrand Sourdais is a young winemaker born and raised in the Loire Valley, where his family have been making wine at Domaine de Pallus, in Chinon for five generations. He studied eonology in Bordeaux, at the renowned Blanquefort school, where he met Ricardo Perez Palacios, nephew to Alvaro Palacios. While achieving stardom in Spain, Bertrand remained passionate for his native Chinon, and for its variety, Cabernet Franc. And so it was inevitable that he would someday apply his gifts at his family's estate, Domaine de Pallus in the appellation's heart in Cravant-les-Côteaux and chart a new course – to honour Chinon's soil and its ancient traditions. Of course, he has completely rethought the winemaking process; he applied biodynamic farming to his vineyards, employed an extended maceration up to thirty days and avoided the mistakes typically made by modernists. The results of his efforts have been a string of utterly profound and critically acclaimed wines.

Tasting notes :

Red berries, raspberry, plum and subtly smoky toasted nuts in the nose lead to an elegant, refined, caressingly silken-textured palate displaying sorbet of red raspberry, roasted red pepper, nut oils and a deep, marrowy sweetness. Elegant and low key, with clear, juicy finishing fruit and subtle smoky, spicy, nutty finishing nuances.

1518 Cahors, Château du Cèdre, South West 2014/15

RED WINES AUSTRIA, SOUTH AFRICA, U.S.A.

1961 Kremstal, Zweigelt, Malat, Furth-Palt Austria 2016

100% Zweigelt. The wine growing region Kremstal is located within the Danube area, about one hour drive to the west of Vienna. The 2,300 hectares of Kremstal stretch around Austrian "wine city" Krems on the northern river bank and around the magnificent monastery "Stift Göttweig" on the southern side of the Danube. Besides rocky soils and deep loess cover, fertile soiles with gravel from the river can be found where we plant our red grapes. Tasting notes :

Bright red fruit, rounded juicy mid palate with a complex herbal finish.

1917 The Four Garces Pinot Noir, Willamette Valley USA 2016

100% Pinot Noir. The Black family purchased an existing vineyard in the Dundee Hills of the Willamette Valley in 2003 as a family retreat. They immediately began turning the estate into a sustainably farmed, well-tended vineyard with the goal of producing rich, elegant, delicious and complex wines. That same year The Four Graces was founded. The winery is named in honor of the Black's four daughters.

Tasting notes :

Pronounced and youthful aromas of blackcurrant leaf, rose petal, earth, black pepper and cassis. A bright palate with low tannin and crisp acidity; blackcurrant, mushroom, bitter chocolate and soft wood flavours with savoury undertones and a hedonistically long and dense finish full of vanillin character and bright fruit flavour.

1752 Kanonkop 'Paul Sauer' Cabs/Merlot, Stellenbosch South Africa 2011 105

1832 Château Montelena, Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley USA 2015 155 86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 13% Merlot, 1% Cabernet Franc. Chateau Montelena Winery, originally called A.L. Tubbs winery after its founder Alfred Tubbs, was constructed in 1888 and intended as a barrel-aging facility. The Chateau was unique in materials, plan, size, and style for its era. In nineteenth-century Napa Valley, the majority of wineries were constructed of wood. The cascade of flavors and textures is prodigious as the palate meanders between rich, dark blackberry jam and lively, almost candied raspberry. The tannins, quite supple at present, add depth and breadth to a robust mouthfeel and converge on subtle earth and tobacco undertones that contrast and highlight the wine's polished and focused acidity.
